“Australia Wins Bid to Host the World Deaf Golf Championships – August 20-29, 2022”

The 2022 World Deaf Golf Championship (WDGC) will come to Queensland’s RACV Royal Pines Resort after a successful joint bid from Deaf Golf Australia and Golf Australia. Australia was awarded the WDGC 2022 bid on July 21st during the WDFG General Meeting after the membership approved of Australia’s presentation of their official bid.

The 72-hole championship will see the world’s best contest the bi-annual championship on the same layout as the Australian PGA Championship in August 2022.

GA National Inclusion Manager Christian Hamilton said that it was a result of many organisations coming together through the bidding process.

“The successful bid was a result of the collaboration of Deaf Golf Australia, Deaf Sports Australia, RACV Royal Pines, Golf Queensland and the City of Gold Coast coming together to show what we can do as a team to deliver a high-class event.”

Deaf Golf Australia is delighted with the decision by the world deaf golf body. “It is the 2nd time the Championships are held in Australia after the successful WDGC event that was hosted at the Joondalup Golf Resort in Perth in 2008”, said Wendy Home – Deaf Golf Australia President.

The decision was celebrated by Australia’s Ambassador to Ireland, Richard Andrews at a reception for the Australian team of 15 golfers last night in Dublin.
